## **School Vision**

## **Introduction**

Kelmscott Primary School has an established dress code for all students attending the school. This is in accordance with the School Education Regulations 2000 and has been endorsed by our School Board. By enrolling your child in our school, you are entering into an agreement to abide by the Kelmscott Primary School Uniform Policy.

Our Uniform Policy is highly recommended for Kindergarten students and compulsory for PP-6 students.



## School Uniform

The school colours are royal blue, white and navy. Any combination of the following is recognised with complying our school dress code.

- Royal blue polo shirt (white collar and white school logo)
- School faction shirt (on sports days and school sporting events)
- Navy skort
- Navy track pants
- Navy cargo pants or shorts
- Navy sports shorts
- Navy yoga pants
- Summer dress (blue and white check)
- Navy leggings (to be worn underneath skort/school dress, not on their own).
- Graduation shirt (Year 6)
- Graduation jacket (Year 6)
- Specialist Program shirts (choir, instrumental, robotics on designated days)
- School jacket, plain royal blue or navy jumper/jacket
- Navy blue, royal blue or school (with logo) broad brimmed hat

## Rationale

We believe that a dress code:

- Fosters and enhances school pride and the public image of our school.
- Encourages equity among students by reducing peer pressure.

## Availability

Items in our school colours, including faction shirts can be purchased from our School Clothing Pool, which is operated by our P&C. The Clothing Pool is open on Monday afternoons and Thursday mornings.





## Non-Compliance

When a student does not follow the Uniform Policy and is not exempt, staff will:

- Discuss the benefits and positive aspects of a school uniform to the students
- Contact the parent or caregiver
- Arrange for the student and their family to be counselled to address and resolve concerns.
- The Principal will determine whether a student is eligible to attend a school excursion in accordance with Regulation 33 (2) School Education Regulations 2000.

## Modifications

Parents of students, who, for ethnic, religious or health reasons, wish to modify the school dress code are required to discuss these with the Principal.





### **Further Information**

- Logos, slogans, motifs, stripes, patterns, jeans, denim or black clothing are not permitted.
- Children must wear school uniform when attending excursions and sporting events.
- For safety reasons, students should not wear any form of jewellery to school other than sleepers or stud earrings and watches.
- Makeup, including nail varnish is prohibited.
- Appropriate enclosed footwear (such as sneakers) must be worn at all times for safety reasons. No backless, high heeled or platform shoes are permitted.
- We have a “Yes Hat, Yes Play in the Sun” policy, which means a broad brimmed hat needs to be worn at all times when playing outside. Students without a hat are required to play in the undercover area.
- Shoulder length hair needs to be tied back for health and safety reasons, preferably using school coloured hair ties.
